Medical Database Upgrades Improve Ability to Send Warfighter Health Data from Theater to the U.S.

On March 22, 2007, the Theater Medical Information Program – Joint (TMIP-J) released version 2.2.3.0 of the Joint Medical Workstation (JMeWS); its key enhancement being the ability to receive and display encounter data from the theater’s inpatient medical documentation application. A sister-database called the Theater Medical Data Store (TMDS) was also upgraded to be able to receive and display theater inpatient encounter data.

JMeWS is a classified database that not only stores inpatient data but also provides critical medical Command & Control functionalities to Combatant Commanders. TMDS is an unclassified database that strictly captures and stores both in and outpatient encounter data from theater.

Other JMeWS 2.2.3.0 enhancements include more refined mapping data for detailed views, easier navigation tools for the user and enhanced disease non-battle injury reporting.

About TMIP-J

The Theater Medical Information Program – Joint (TMIP-J) is an integrated suite of software that supports complete clinical care documentation, medical supply and equipment tracking, patient movement visibility, and health surveillance in an austere communications environment. As part of the Military Health System, TMIP-J provides medical information management technology to support the U.S. Military’s deployed medical business practice. It also serves as the medical component for both the Global Combat Support System and the Global Command and Control System. TMIP-J is being used successfully by the Marine Corps in Operation Iraqi Freedom, the Air Force in Balad and Bagram hospitals, the Navy in Kuwait and the Army in over 100 units, including 50 medical units and 12 combat support hospitals.
